#### Limitations of CRA Data

- Compliance vs content
- Only operating charities (grassroots, non-profits not included)
- CRA has changed method of classification over time
- Imperfect data submitted by charities
- Does not include operating charities whose primary purpose is not environmental (e.g. universities)
- Assumptions all funds toward orgs classified as environmental are environmentally focused

A better estimate requires better data.



- Adjusted for inflation
- Combination of 2 classification codes (Program Code + Category Code) = just under 1400
   environmental operating charities (cross-checked with grantees of EFC member organizations)
- Includes different sources of revenue:
  - Government funding
  - Gifts from other charities (e.g. foundations)
  - Receipted gifts (e.g. donations from individuals)
  - Unreceipted gifts
  - Unreceipted gifts from fundraising (e.g. event sponsorship)
  - Sales of goods & services (e.g. social enterprise, fee-for-service)

## When you consider total revenue from ALL SOURCES, 2% is not accurate.

It's actually 0.5% for environmentally-focused operating charities



## However, 2% IS accurate for these sources of revenue:


- Gifts from other charities
- Receipted donations
- Unreceipted gifts from fundraising

In comparison, 0.3% of total government funding is allocated to environmental operating charities.





#### Sources of Revenue Surprises

- Gifts from other charities contribute less to environmental charities than sales of good & services and receipted gifts
- Government funding contributes 4.5X more revenue than gifts from other charities. Therefore, even though the % of government funding allocated to environmental charities is only 0.3%, very large increases in total dollars are required to maintain that percentage as total government funding grows (in comparison to maintaining 2% of other sources of growing revenue



# Environmental charities are becoming increasingly reliant on government funding as a percentage of total revenue

Year	% from other charities	% from government
2002	2%	26%
2006	20%	26%
2017	7%	38%
2021	9%	41%



#### Other Reference Points

- PFC Environment = 4% (200 largest foundations from 2013-2018)
- Canada Helps Environment = 1.5%, or 3.9% during climate-driven crises such as emergency support during 2023 wildfires (receipted gifts via Canada Helps platform)

We can reasonably conclude that these two sources of revenue (gifts from other charities and receipted gifts) are not higher than 4%.

Climate Works Foundation – 2% for climate mitigation (global philanthropy).

How much higher would the global percentage be than Canada's if this were an apples-toapples comparison?



## What We Are Funding

2022 Grants Data from EFC Members



- 2022 Grants Data, 44 Funders, 1,941 grants
- Collected between July Sept, 2023
- Accepted in any form, template provided
- Keyword search relies on grant titles and grant descriptions
- Identified member-to-member giving and categorized it as either programming or regranting





#### **SEVEN DISTINCT CATEGORIES**

- Conservation
- Climate Change
- Nature Education
- Food & Agriculture
- Pollution & Toxics
- Waste Reduction
- Other (includes general operating and organizational support grants)

#### ADDITIONAL LAYER: INDIGENOUS FOCUSED WORK

(overlaps with each of the categories above)





#### ITERATIVE REFINEMENT OF KEYWORD SEARCH TERMS

- Started with our best guess
- Eliminate terms that generate very little, overlap in more than one category
- Reviewed grants not captured, added additional search words and categories
- Excluded terms from different categories e.g. conservation search terms minus words that are almost always associated with nature education (e.g. schools, children)
- Addition of category tags where insufficient grant titles and descriptions provided
- Result: distinct keywords for each category that can be reused each year!



#### Limitations

#### TRENDS IN FAVOUR OF ACCURACY

- Overlap counting in locations
- Overlap counting in environmental categories (less than 20%)

#### **Chart 1. 2022 Grant Dollars by Geographic Focus**







Chart 2. Percentage of 2022 Grant Dollars Awarded by Geographic Focus





#### **Chart 3. 2022 Grant Dollars by Environmental Category**






Chart 4. Percentage of 2022 Grant Dollars by Environmental Category






Chart 5. Breakdown of Categories of Investment in Indigenous Focused Grants







Chart 6. Percentage of 2022 Grant Dollars Awarded by Geographic Location and Environmental Category




# Some interesting U.S. Data from *Tracking the Field* (2007–2021) Environmental Grantmakers Assoc.



#### Overall Environmental Funding

#### EGA Members' Total Environmental Grantmaking Over Time, 2007–2021




- 2021 had the largest yearover-year increase in environmental funding observed by EGA since 2007.
- The increase of environmental funding outpaced the growth of overall philanthropic giving.
- Despite this increase, environmental grantmaking is still largely insufficient relative to the urgency and scale of the growing global environmental crisis.


EGA Members' Grantmaking by International Region and Primary Issue Group, 2021





#### WHAT Do EGA Members Fund?

EGA Members' Environmental Grantmaking by Primary Issue Area, 2009-2021




- In 2021, "Energy & Climate" remained the most-funded primary issue group with the most increase in funding dollars, receiving \$705 million or 31% of the total funding.
- "Health & Justice" funding nearly tripled compared to 2017.
- Conservation issues
   (Biodiversity, Land and Water) continued to receive about one-third of the total funding.





#### **HOW Do EGA Members Fund?**

#### EGA Members' Environmental Grantmaking by Strategy, 2009-2021



- Funders are giving much larger grants. 2021 saw the largest median grant size (\$48,628) ever recorded by EGA.
- "General Operating" funding surged since 2019, accounting for 21% of total funding in 2021.
- Funding to "Grassroots
   Organizing" and "Public
   Policy" both doubled from
   2020 to 2021.


- EFC Only

#### WHO Do EGA Members Fund?

EGA Members' Environmental Grantmaking by Communities Impacted, 2021



- From 2019 to 2021, funding to "Communities of Color" more than doubled (from \$140M to \$330M), with over 80% of all EGA members giving at least one grant directed to this group.
- Of the \$198 million given to "Low-Income Communities," two thirds supported domestic initiatives.
- "Women" and gender-equity issues received the least support out of all groups.
